The street sign at 325th and 360th the top street sign is missing. Leroy avenue does not have chloride. The county is not going to help with getting residents to keep their property maintained unless they change their ordinances. There was a motion made to ask the county to change ordinances in an attempt to have the county help us have residents maintain their properties. Motion passed.
